#### IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT THE LORD'S SUPPER:


The Bible teaches that along with the bread and wine of Holy Communion we also receive the true body and blood of our Savior. Jesus' own words, "this is my body" and "this is my blood for the forgiveness of sins" reveal His Real Presence in the sacrament (Luke 22, I Cor. 10:15-16). The Bible also teaches (1 Cor. 11:23-32) the Lord's Supper, properly received brings great blessings, but improperly received without understanding can actually incur God's judgment. If you are a baptized Christian who has been instructed in the Biblical teaching of communion, please feel free to commune today. If you have any questions, please first speak to a pastor.

As you come forward, gluten free wafers are available by request, as well as individual cup choice of wine or lighter colored non-alcoholic grape juice (located in the center of the trays). Common cup is also offered during Traditional Praise services at the altar only.

The Lord's Supper is celebrated in Traditional Praise on the first, third, and fifth weekends of the month; and in Modern Praise on the second and fourth weekends of the month.

# **WORSHIP CELEBRATION**





Please pray for the Rochester Planning Commission Meeting occurring this week Monday, November 7 at 7:00pm where our proposed Phase 2 expansion plans are being presented and voted on with a recommendation for approval! The Lord's will be done!

#### PROPOSAL 3 STATEMENT

As a church and school of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod we hold to a biblical worldview which recognizes our ultimate hope as followers of Jesus is not in any kingdom of this world. At the same time, the Lord has truly blessed us with freedom as Christian citizens of this country, and with that freedom comes a responsibility to vote as fully informed people of faith. It is in this same spirit of keeping you fully informed, and consistent with our faith through God's Word promoting the sanctity of life and family values, that we prayerfully ask you to consider voting NO on Proposal 3 as presented on the upcoming November 8th state election ballot. A review of the proposal reveals confusing language and some very disturbing positions that would be permanently embedded in Michigan's Constitution. Proposal 3 invalidates several long-standing state laws that reasonably limit abortions, protect our children and parental rights, and ensure the health and safety of women. 
